- 2.24** “**Public Advertisement**” shall mean an announcement dated 30.07.2021 in newspaper(s) inviting an expression of interest from the Bidders, who shall submit their Bid to participate in the liquidation process of the Company in accordance with the provisions of IBC and Liquidation Process Regulations;

- 2.27 “**Reserve Price**” shall mean the price of Rs. 25.02 Cr arrived at for the Corporate Debtor on going concern basis, pursuant to the provisions of the Liquidation Process Regulations;
- 2.28 “**Site Visit**” shall mean a visit to the Site; and
- 2.29 “**Successful Bidder**” means, the Qualified Bidder whose Bid is approved and who is declared successful by the Liquidator at the end of the determined auction phase as per the provision of this E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern), provisions of IBC and the Liquidation Process Regulations and shall include the SPV (if any) through which the Successful Bidder proposes to consummate the sale transaction as per this E-Auction Process Document.
- 2.30 “**Taxes**” means any taxes including any stamp duty, interest tax, excise duties, customs duties, value added tax, sales tax, local taxes, charges, cess, income tax, TDS, TCS, GST, CST, entry tax, octroi and any impost or surcharge of like nature (whether central, state or local) charged, levied or imposed by any governmental authority, as per the requirements of Applicable Laws.

Capitalized terms used herein but not defined otherwise shall have meaning prescribed to them under the provisions of the IBC, the Liquidation Process Regulations and Applicable Law(s) to such terms as the context may require.

3. INTRODUCTION

- 3.1 M/s Randstad India Private Limited filed an application under Section 9 read with Rule 6 for the initiation of Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process as per the provisions of IBC, wherein the Application was admitted by the NCLT vide its order dated June 14, 2018 (“**CIRP Order**”). Pursuant to the CIRP Order, the management of the affairs of the Company were vested with Ms. Medha Kulkarni, the Interim Resolution Professional of the Company (“**IRP**”) appointed by the NCLT. Subsequently, Mr. Suresh Kannan was appointed as the Resolution Professional (“**RP**”) vide Order dated November 20, 2019 of NCLT. The RP had been vested with the responsibility to manage the affairs of the Company and to further perform all such duties and acts as prescribed under Section 17 read with 23(2) of IBC. Since no Resolution Plan was received during CIRP period, the Application for Liquidation was filed before the NCLT by the Liquidator, subsequent to voting by COC in the 11th meeting of COC. The said Application for Liquidation of Camson Bio Technologies Limited submitted by the RP was admitted by the NCLT vide its order dated December 03, 2020, and published on December 11, 2020 at NCLT website. Pursuant to the Liquidation Order, the RP was appointed as the Liquidator to conduct the Liquidation Process of the Company in accordance with the provisions of IBC and Liquidation Process Regulations.

- 3.2 Further, in view of the Order dated 03.12.2020 and that the CoC during the CIRP process had not identified the assets and liabilities under sub-regulation (2) of regulation 39C of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (Insolvency Resolution Process for Corporate Persons) Regulations, the Liquidator in consultation with the stakeholder consultation committee (SCC) during the SCC meeting dated 12.07.2021 agreed to group the assets and liabilities of the Corporate Debtor and offer to sale of the Corporate debtor as a going concern under liquidation.
- 3.3 This document covers the terms and conditions and Reserve Price for sale of the Corporate Debtor as a going concern.
- 3.4 It is the endeavor of the Liquidator to conduct the sale of Company on going concern basis, as per the Liquidation Order dated 03.12.2020 and in accordance with the provisions of IBC and the Liquidation Process Regulations for sale of the corporate debtor as a going concern through E- Auction, read with any other Applicable Law(s) in the manner specified in this E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern).
- 3.5 The E-Auction would be conducted in the manner specified in the Liquidation Process Regulations and any other rules, regulations, orders, circulars, directions or notifications issued pursuant to or under IBC or the Liquidation Process Regulations, as the case may be, and as per directions, if any, of the NCLT in respect of the liquidation process of the Company and in the manner as specified in this E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern).
- 3.6 The Bidders are encouraged to make themselves acquainted with the provisions of the IBC and the Liquidation Process Regulations and any other rules, regulations, orders, circulars, directions or notifications or the like, issued pursuant to or under the IBC or the Liquidation Process Regulations, as the case maybe.

4. AN OVERVIEW OF THE COMPANY

4.1 Camson Bio Technologies Limited, a company incorporated on November 19, 1993, having its registered office at C 7, 7th Floor, Corporate Block Golden Enclave, Old Airport Road, Bangalore 560017, is a non-government Company, limited by shares and is an agricultural biotechnology company. The Company initiated the concept of zero residue cultivation with the use of microbial extracts for the control of pest, diseases and soil health, first time in the country. The Corporate Debtor had revenues and other income equal to Rs. 81,764,178 in Financial Year 2019. The detailed information of the Company and information memorandum is also uploaded in the Data Room.

4.2 Present Status

NCLT has vide the Liquidation Order had ordered commencement of liquidation process of the Company as per Section 33 of the IBC read with Liquidation Process Regulations. Pursuant to the Liquidation Order, the Resolution Professional was appointed as the Liquidator to perform its duties as per the provisions of the IBC and Liquidation Process Regulations. The Liquidator is in the process of inviting qualified bidders to participate in the E- Auction for

sale of Company on going concern basis in accordance with the provisions of IBC and Liquidation Process Regulations, subject to the terms laid down in this E-Auction Process Document.

Filing of Avoidance application under Sections 45 & 66 of the Insolvency & Bankruptcy Code, 2016

The Resolution Professional (now Liquidator), while carrying out the Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process appointed a transaction auditor for identifying and examining of the transactions falling under Sections 43, 45, 49, 50 & 66 and upon successful examination of the same, three applications have been filed under Sections 45, 46, 48, 49 & 66 of the Insolvency & Bankruptcy Code, 2016 read with Rule 11 of the NCLT Rules, 2016 for avoidance of undervalued and fraudulent transactions.

The dispute with respect to the leasehold rights in relation to the land/building (*admeasuring 33.5 Acres with buildings having (Built up area: 10,082 Sq. Mtr.) at Near Srirama High School, Doddaballapur – Nelamangala Road, Madagondanahalli Village, Madhure Hobli, Doddaballapur Taluka, Bengaluru Rural District*) have been made part of the said application as stated above and the order of the Hon'ble NCLT on the same is awaited.

Further, it is clarified that the sale price in respect of the assets of the leasehold rights in the land/building, plant & machinery and the corporate office (for 50% of the share) has been fixed and shall be sold as a going concern basis.

Section 32A of the Code

Section 32A was included in Insolvency Bankruptcy Code on 28.12.2019, and which states that, —

No action shall be taken against the property of the corporate debtor in relation to an offence committed prior to commencement of the Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process, where such property is covered under a Resolution Plan approved by the NCLT, which results in change of management of the Corporate Debtor or sale of liquidation assets to a person who is not:

- a) A promoter or in the management or control of the Corporate Debtor or a related party of such a person,*
- b) A person with regard to whom the relevant investigating authority has, on the basis of material in its possession, reason to believe that he had abetted or conspired for the commission of the offence, and has submitted or filed a report or a complaint to the relevant statutory authority or Court.*

The explanation to the Section 32A specifically states that an action against the property of the corporate debtor in relation to an offence shall include the attachment, seizure, retention or confiscation of such property under such law as may be applicable to the corporate debtor.

Section 32A and Validity reinstated by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in January 2021

Further, the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the matter of Manish Kumar vs. Union of India (Writ Petition No. 26 of 2020) has upheld Section 32A of the IBC 2016. The relevant excerpt of the

Judgment dated 19.01.2021 are as follows:

—257. *We are of the clear view that no case whatsoever is made out to seek invalidation of Section 32A. The boundaries of this Court's jurisdiction are clear. The wisdom of the legislation is not open to judicial review. Having regard to the object of the Code, the experience of the working of the code, the interests of all stakeholders including most importantly the imperative need to attract resolution applicants who would not shy away from offering reasonable and fair value as part of the resolution plan if the legislature thought that immunity be granted to the corporate debtor as also its property, it hardly furnishes a ground for this Court to interfere. The provision is carefully thought out. It is not as if the wrongdoers are allowed to get away. They remain liable. The extinguishment of the criminal liability of the corporate debtor is apparently important to the new management to make a clean break with the past and start on a clean slate. We must also not overlook the principle that the impugned provision is part of an economic measure. The reverence courts justifiably hold such laws in cannot but be applicable in the instant case as well. The provision deals with reference to offences committed prior to the commencement of the CIRP. With the admission of the application the management of the corporate debtor passes into the hands of the Interim Resolution Professional and thereafter into the hands of the Resolution Professional subject undoubtedly to the control by the Committee of Creditors. As far as protection afforded to the property is concerned there is clearly a rationale behind it. Having regard to the object of the statute we hardly see any manifest arbitrariness in the provision.*

5. ELIGIBILITY

A Bidder shall not be eligible to submit a Bid in relation to the sale of the Company if it fails to meet the Legal Criteria and Pre Bid Qualifications as set out below:

Legal Criteria:

Proviso to Section 35A (f) of the IBC provides that the Liquidator shall not sell the assets of the Company to any person who is not eligible to be a resolution applicant. Section 29A of IBC defines the persons not eligible to be resolution applicant. Section 29 A of the IBC is reproduced as below for reference purposes only:

“Sec 29A. Persons not eligible to be resolution applicant:

A person shall not be eligible to submit a resolution plan, if such person, or any other person acting jointly or in concert with such person-

- a) *is an un-discharged insolvent;*
- b) *is a willful defaulter in accordance with the guidelines of the Reserve Bank of India issued under the Banking Regulation Act, 1949 (10 of 1949);*
- c) *at the time of submission of the resolution plan has an account, or an account of a corporate debtor under the management or control of such person or of whom such person is a promoter, classified as non-performing asset in accordance with the guidelines of the Reserve Bank of India issued under the Banking Regulation Act, 1949 (10 of 1949) or the guidelines of a financial sector regulator issued under any other law for the time being in force, and at least a period of one year has lapsed from the date of such classification till the date of commencement of the corporate insolvency resolution process of the corporate debtor.*

Provided that the person shall be eligible to submit a resolution plan if such person makes payment of all overdue amounts with interest thereon and charges relating to nonperforming asset accounts before submission of resolution plan;

Provided further that nothing in this clause shall apply to a resolution applicant where such applicant is a financial entity and is not a related party to the corporate debtor.

Explanation I - For the purposes of this proviso, the expression "related party" shall not include a financial entity, regulated by a financial sector regulator, if it is a financial creditor of the corporate debtor and is a related party of the corporate debtor solely on account of conversion or substitution of debt into equity shares or instruments convertible into equity shares, prior to the insolvency commencement date.

Explanation II - For the purposes of this clause, where a resolution applicant has an account, or an account of a corporate debtor under the management or control of such person or of whom such person is a promoter, classified as non-performing asset

and such account was acquired pursuant to a prior resolution plan approved under this Code, then, the provisions of this clause shall not apply to such resolution applicant for a period of three years from the date of approval of such resolution plan by the Adjudicating Authority under this Code;

d) has been convicted for any offence punishable with imprisonment—

(i) for two years or more under any Act specified under the Twelfth Schedule; or

(ii) for seven years or more under any law for the time being in force:

Provided that this clause shall not apply to a person after the expiry of a period of two years from the date of his release from imprisonment:

Provided further that this clause shall not apply in relation to a connected person referred to in clause (iii) of Explanation I;

e) is disqualified to act as a director under the Companies Act, 2013 (18 of 2013);

Provided that this clause shall not apply in relation to a connected person referred to in clause (iii) of Explanation I;

f) is prohibited by the Securities and Exchange Board of India from trading in securities or accessing the securities markets;

g) has been a promoter or in the management or control of a corporate debtor in which a preferential transaction, undervalued transaction, extortionate credit transaction or fraudulent transaction has taken place and in respect of which an order has been made by the Adjudicating Authority under this Code:

Provided that this clause shall not apply if a preferential transaction, undervalued transaction, extortionate credit transaction or fraudulent transaction has taken place prior to the acquisition of the corporate debtor by the resolution applicant pursuant to a resolution plan approved under this Code or pursuant to a scheme or plan approved by a financial sector regulator or a court, and such resolution applicant has not otherwise contributed to the preferential transaction, undervalued transaction, extortionate credit transaction or fraudulent transaction;

h) has executed a guarantee in favour of a creditor in respect of a corporate debtor against which an application for insolvency resolution made by such creditor has been admitted under this Code and such guarantee has been invoked by the creditor and remains unpaid in full or part;

i) is subject to any disability, corresponding to clauses (a) to (h), under any law in a jurisdiction outside India; or

j) has a connected person not eligible under clauses (a) to (i).

Explanation I - For the purposes of this clause, the expression —connected person means

- i. any person who is the promoter or in the management or control of the resolution applicant; or*
- ii. any person who shall be the promoter or in management or control of the business of the corporate debtor during the implementation of the resolution plan; or*
- iii. the holding company, subsidiary company, associate company or related party of a person referred to in clauses (i) and(ii)*

Provided that nothing in clause (iii) of Explanation I shall apply to a resolution applicant where such applicant is a financial entity and is not a related party of the corporate debtor:

Provided further that the expression "related party" shall not include a financial entity, regulated by a financial sector regulator, if it is a financial creditor of the corporate debtor and is a related party of the corporate debtor solely on account of conversion or substitution of debt into equity shares or instruments convertible into equity shares, prior to the insolvency commencement date;

Explanation II - For the purposes of this section, "financial entity" shall mean the following entities which meet such criteria or conditions as the Central Government may, in consultation with the financial sector regulator, notify in this behalf, namely: —

- (a) a scheduled bank;*
- (b) any entity regulated by a foreign central bank or a securities market regulator or other financial sector regulator of a jurisdiction outside India which jurisdiction is compliant with the Financial Action Task Force Standards and is a signatory to the International Organization of Securities Commissions Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding;*
- (c) any investment vehicle, registered foreign institutional investor, registered foreign portfolio investor or a foreign venture capital investor, where the terms shall have the meaning assigned to them in regulation 2 of the Foreign Exchange Management (Transfer or Issue of Security by a Person Resident Outside India) Regulations, 2017 made under the Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999 (42 of 1999);*
- (d) an asset reconstruction company register with the Reserve Bank of India under section 3 of the Securitization and Reconstruction of Financial Assets and Enforcement of Security Interest Act, 2002 (54 of 2002);*
- (e) an Alternate Investment Fund registered with Securities and Exchange Board of India;*
- (f) such categories of persons as may be notified by the Central Government..*

PRE BID QUALIFICATIONS

A bidder shall not be eligible to submit a bid during the auction process, if the following eligibility criteria, being the pre-bid qualifications are not met:

Eligibility Criteria for Companies/LLP/OPC registered with Registrar of Companies under Companies Act

- a) Minimum Net Worth of Rs. 20 Crore as per the Financial Statements of the latest Financial Year;
- b) None of the connected persons including its directors/designated partners/partners have been convicted for any criminal offence under the Indian Criminal Laws;
- c) Is not prohibited by the Securities and Exchange Board of India from trading in securities or accessing the securities markets;

Eligibility Criteria for Firms/Sole Proprietorship/HUF/Partnership

- a) Minimum Net Worth of Rs. 20 Crore as per the Financial Statements of the latest Financial Year;
- b) None of the connected persons including its directors/designated partners/partners have been convicted for any criminal offence under the Indian Criminal Laws;
- c) None of its designated partners/partners are disqualified to act as a “director” under the Companies Act, 2013;
- d) Is not prohibited by the Securities and Exchange Board of India from trading in securities or accessing the securities markets;

Prior to bidding, the bidder is required to provide the latest Financial Statements and other necessary documents required to assess the above criteria to the Liquidator. The Liquidator has a discretion to accept bids/offers/interest beyond the above minimum eligibility criteria, in case, the same ensures highest realization to the stakeholders.

6. DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO BE SUBMITTED TO ASCERTAIN ELIGIBILITY OF THE BIDDER

- 6.1** The Bidder would need to submit the following forms, documents and authorizations as part of the E-Auction by the Bidder(s) as per the timelines prescribed in this E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern):
 - 6.1.1 Ownership structure and composition of the Bidder, Proof of Identification, Current Address-Proof, PAN card, valid e-mail ID, Landline and mobile phone number etc.
 - 6.1.2 Authorization to the Signatory (in case the bidder is a legal entity).
 - 6.1.3 The interested bidder must submit the Affidavit and Undertaking and Confidentiality Undertaking (through Authorized Signatory, in case the bidder is a legal entity). The format for the Affidavit and Undertaking is attached vide **Annexure I** and the format for the Confidentiality Undertaking is attached vide **Annexure V**.
 - 6.1.4 The interested bidder must submit the details under **Annexure VI** and provide the undertaking

and affidavit for eligibility under **Annexure VII**.

- 6.2** A Qualified Bidder will need to submit the duly filled, signed and stamped Bid Application Form attached vide **Annexure II**, and duly filled, signed and stamped Bid Declaration Form by Bidders attached vide **Annexure III**. Please note that only the Qualified Bidder(s) will gain access to Data Room, Information Memorandum, documentation, additional information in relation to the Company required for due diligence after due submission of the requisite forms, documents and authorizations; Affidavit and Undertaking; executing a Confidentiality Undertaking stated in para 6.1.1 to para 6.1.3 above.
- 6.3** Further, it should be noted that at any stage of the E-Auction Process, the Liquidator may ask for further documents from the Bidder(s) to evaluate their eligibility. The Liquidator, at his discretion may disqualify the Bidder(s) for non-submission of the requested documents.

7. SITE VISIT

- 7.1** The Qualified Bidder is expected to make its own arrangements including accommodation for the Site Visit. All costs and expenses incurred in relation to Site Visits shall be borne by the Qualified Bidder.
- 7.2** In Site Visit, the Qualified Bidder(s) may carry out its own comprehensive due diligence in respect of the Company and shall be deemed to have full knowledge of the condition of the Company, its assets, relevant documents, information etc. whether or not the Qualified Bidder actually inspects or participates in the Site Visit or verifies the document provided by the Liquidator. During the Site Visit, a Qualified Bidder shall not:
- (i) Take any photographs of the Site or take any documents back with it; or
 - (ii) Initiate any discussion regarding the Liquidation Process, with the personnel at Site, during the course of its Site Visit.
- 7.3** The Qualified Bidder shall not be entitled to receive any reimbursement of any expenses which may have been incurred in carrying out of due diligence, search of title to the assets and matters incidental thereto or for any purpose in connection with the Bid.
- 7.4** Any delay in completion of the Site Visit by the Qualified Bidder, shall not entitle the Qualified Bidder to any extension in the timelines, including the timeline for completion of such Site Visit or submission of the Bid, by or before the last date for submission of the Bid.
- 7.5** The Qualified Bidder may request the Liquidator to arrange for physical verification and site visit of the Corporate Debtor. Upon receipt of such a request, the Liquidator may first arrange a discussion meeting at any time prior to the closure of the e-auction process. The details with respect to the discussion meeting shall be communicated to the Qualified Bidder in advance. The Liquidator reserves the right to not arrange such a discussion meeting for any reason whatsoever, irrespective of the request of the Eligible Bidder.
- 7.6** The Liquidator may coordinate a site visit for Qualified Bidders at any time prior to the closure

of the E-Auction process, following a request for such a visit by the Qualified Bidders. The Liquidator will communicate, in advance, to such Qualified Bidder, all the relevant details, terms and conditions, if any, with respect to such Site Visit. The Liquidator reserves the right to not arrange a site visit for any reason whatsoever, irrespective of the request of the Qualified Bidder.

8. SALE UNDER LIQUIDATION AS A GOING CONCERN

8.1 The Liquidator under this E-Auction Process Document, proposes sale of Company on going concern basis in accordance with the provisions of IBC, 2016 and IBBI (Liquidation Process) Regulations, 2016

"32A. Sale as a going concern

(1) Where the committee of creditors has recommended sale under clause (e) or (f) of regulation 32 or where the liquidator is of the opinion that sale under clause (e) or (f) of regulation 32 shall maximize the value of the corporate debtor, he shall endeavor to first sell under the said clauses.

(2) For the purpose of sale under sub-regulation (1), the group of assets and liabilities of the corporate debtor, as identified by the committee of creditors under sub-regulation (2) of regulation 39C of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (Insolvency Resolution Process for Corporate Persons) Regulations, 2016 shall be sold as a going concern.

(3) Where the committee of creditors has not identified the assets and liabilities under sub-regulation (2) of regulation 39C of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (Insolvency Resolution Process for Corporate Persons) Regulations, 2016, the liquidator shall identify and group the assets and liabilities to be sold as a going concern, in consultation with the consultation committee.

(4) If the liquidator is unable to sell the corporate debtor or its business under clause (e) or (f) of regulation 32 within ninety days from the liquidation commencement date, he shall proceed to sell the assets of the corporate debtor under clauses (a) to (d) of regulation 32."

8.2 **It is clarified that the sale of the Company as a going concern basis under this E - Auction Process, is subject to receipt of the Final Approval Order from the Adjudicating Authority. The procedure for the E-auction Process and the declaration of the Successful Bidder shall be as per the terms of the E-Auction Process Document. On the close of the E-auction, the Liquidator shall declare the Successful Bidder and on receipt of the 1st Installment from the Successful Bidder, the Liquidator shall make an application to the Judicial Authority as per the timelines set out herein. The process of consummation of the sale of the Company as a going concern to the Successful Bidder as per the terms of this E-Auction Process Document shall commence from the date of the Final Approval Order from the Judicial Authority. The Liquidator shall not be responsible and liable, in any manner, in the event the Judicial Authority in its Final Order rejects the sale transaction contemplated hereunder. The liability and obligations of the Successful Bidder shall continue till the receipt of the Final Order and thereafter as per the terms of the Final Order and/or the Liquidation Process Regulations and/or this E-Auction Process Document and/or the LOI.**

8.3 **Identification of assets and liabilities for sale and methodology adopted for sale by the**

Liquidator

In view of the liquidation order dated 03.12.2020 and that the CoC during the CIR Process had not identified the assets and liabilities under sub-regulation (2) of regulation 39C of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (Insolvency Resolution Process for Corporate Persons) Regulations, the Liquidator in consultation with the stakeholder consultation committee (SCC) during the SCC meeting dated 12.07.2020 agreed to group the assets and liabilities of the Corporate Debtor and offer sale of the Corporate Debtor as a going concern.

This document covers the terms and conditions for sale of the Corporate Debtor as a going concern and the Reserve Price thereunder.

Details of the assets for sale of Corporate Debtor as a going concern are provided in the Information Memorandum on “Camson Bio Technologies Limited – Sale under Liquidation as Going Concern” that can be accessed in the Data Room provided by the Liquidator post execution of the Confidentiality Agreement.

All the other liabilities pertaining to the Corporate Debtor being sold as going concern, subject to the approval of the Judicial Authority, shall be settled, paid and extinguished as per Section 53 of IBC.

On receipt of the entire sale consideration (plus applicable taxes and costs as determined by the Liquidator), the Liquidator (in his discretion) shall issue a power of attorney in favour of the Successful Bidder for certain limited purposes such as authorizing the Successful Bidder to facilitate transfer of licenses and permissions, other approvals of the Company in its name, etc.

The Liquidator shall not be responsible in any manner for assisting/coordinating/obtaining any transfers/renewals/permissions/approvals whether of any documents/license and permissions/approvals/insurance policies/ either in the name of the Corporate Debtor or the Successful Bidder and the sole responsibility for the same shall vest with the Successful Bidder.

It is clarified that apart from the sale certificate and the power of attorney, the Liquidator shall not be required to execute any other document in favour of the Successful Bidder for carrying out and effectuating the sale as per the E-Auction Process.

It is pertinent to mention that any amount as received into the existing bank accounts of the Corporate Debtor as on sale certificate date realised from the current assets of the company, pursuant to the takeover, shall be transferred to the Liquidation Account mentioned in para 11.4.2 below.

The Successful Bidder agrees and acknowledges that it shall be solely responsible for carrying out necessary actions and obtaining necessary approvals in order to effectuate fully the purposes, terms and conditions of the sale of the Company as a going concern to it, including but not limited to, obtaining or renewing any license, consent, certificate, permit or other authorization, including procuring all necessary approvals from Persons governmental and statutory authorities, if any, as may be required.

Excluded Assets

Kindly note that the Liquidator has filed an application u/s Sections 45 & 66 under IBC 2016 (avoidance of undervalued transactions, fraudulent transactions) with the NCLT against the ex-Directors of the Corporate Debtor during the Corporate Insolvency Process. Any proceeds

and/or assets received on account of the applications filed under these sections 45 & 66, shall not form part of the liquidation sale under the E-Auction, however, shall be part of the liquidation estate, for distribution to the stake holders. In the event, any assets are reversed to the ownership of the Corporate Debtor, the Successful Bidder shall make necessary arrangement as required by the Liquidator for enabling the Liquidator to sell those assets separately as part of the liquidation estate.

Any existing personal guarantees issued by the promoters/ any other group companies of the Corporate Debtor shall not form part of the liquidation sale under the E-Auction.

Any assets (owned by third parties) mortgaged to the lenders of the Company but not owned by the Company shall not form part of the liquidation sale under the E-Auction.

The Excluded Assets do not form a part of liquidation estate of the Company and hence will not be a part of the sale process as per the E-Auction herein contemplated. In the event there are any further Excluded Assets, the Liquidator shall upload the list of the same on the Data Room.

8.4 Subject to NCLT approval of transfer of leasehold/licensed rights

In compliance to Regulation 32A (1) of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (Liquidation Process) Regulations, 2016, The Liquidator in the First SCC meeting held on 12.07.2021 apprised the members of the SCC that for maximization of the value of the assets of the Corporate Debtor, endeavor shall be made to sell the Corporate Debtor as a going concern. On the receipt of approval from the SCC members for selling the Corporate Debtor as a going Concern, the Liquidator is carrying out the said process.

An application for the transfer of the leasehold rights in favour of the Successful Bidder in respect of the land/building (*admeasuring 33.5 Acres with buildings located at Near Srirama High School, Doddaballapur – Nelamangala Road, Madagondanahalli Village, Madhure Hobli, Doddaballapur Taluka, Bengaluru Rural District*) has been filed before the Hon'ble NCLT, Bengaluru Bench, Bangalore on 25.02.2020 and the order of the Hon'ble NCLT on the same is awaited.

Liquidation Regulation 32A (4) says that “If the liquidator is unable to sell the corporate debtor or its business under clause (e) or (f) of regulation 32 within ninety days from the liquidation commencement date, he shall proceed to sell the assets of the corporate debtor under clauses (a) to (d) of regulation 32.”

9. DUE DILIGENCE/DATA ROOM/CLARIFICATIONS

- 9.1** The Liquidator shall endeavor to provide necessary assistance, facilitating the due diligence by Qualified Bidders. The information and documents shall be provided by the Liquidator in good faith.

The Liquidator proposes sale of Corporate Debtor on going concern basis in accordance with the provisions of IBC and Liquidation Process Regulations on “As is where is basis”, “As is what is basis”, “Whatever there is basis” and “No recourse” basis and the proposed sale as specified above does not entail transfer of any title, except the title which the Corporate Debtor has on the assets as on date of the transfer. All local taxes / maintenance fee / electricity / water charges/ annual lease rentals / unearned income in case of leasehold assets/ insurance premiums/license renewal fees/ license transfer fees and other charges, costs and expenses in connection with the Corporate Debtor or any of its assets as determined by the Liquidator, etc., outstanding as on date or yet to fall due in respect of the relevant asset should be ascertained by the Bidder and would be borne by the Successful Bidder from the date of declaration as Successful Bidder and shall be due and payable immediately as and when intimated by the Liquidator or along with the payment of the balance sale consideration (at the Liquidator’s discretion), as per the instructions of the Liquidator but shall in any event be payable prior to issuance of the sale certificate/sale deed by the Liquidator in favour of the Successful Bidder.

It must also be noted that the Liquidator does not give any assurance or warranty of the physical condition of the assets and their suitability for any sort of operation that the bidder envisages.

9.2 Clarifications:

- 9.2.1 While the data/ information provided in this E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern) and the Data Room, has been prepared and provided in good faith, the Liquidator and their Representatives shall not accept any responsibility or liability, whatsoever, in respect of any statements or omissions herein, or the accuracy, correctness, completeness or reliability of the information provided, and shall incur no liability under any law, statute, rules or regulations as to the accuracy, reliability and completeness of the information provided, even if any loss or damage is caused to any of the Bidder by any act or omission on their part.
- 9.2.2 It is further clarified that the data/information provided in the Data Room has been prepared based on books of accounts, financial statements and discussions and representations by the erstwhile directors and key managerial personnel of the Company. Reasonable care has been taken in compiling various data and information, however the Liquidator along their advisors, consultants, representatives, make no representation or warranties, express or implied, as to the quality, accuracy, authenticity, correctness, fairness and completeness of the data provided in the Data Room, and assume no liability whatsoever in respect of any inaccuracy, incompleteness, or omissions in the data provided in the Data Room.
- 9.2.3 Any clarification uploaded in the Data Room shall be binding on all the Bidders and shall be deemed to form part of this E -Auction Process Information Document. No request for modifications of the clarifications shall be entertained, however, the Liquidator, may, in a fit case and as per his discretion, issue modification to the clarifications, if required. Such modifications(s) shall be binding on all the Bidders and shall be deemed to modify the

clarification and be read as a part of this E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern).

- 9.2.4 A Bidder requiring any clarification on this E- Auction Process Information Document, Liquidation Process, submission of the Bid or on the Company shall email such request for clarification to camson@aaainsolvency.com with a copy to suresh.kannan@aaainsolvency.com
- 9.2.5 The Liquidator reserves the right not to respond to any query or provide any clarification, at their sole discretion, and no extension of time and date referred to in this E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern) shall be granted on the basis of not having received response to clarifications sought from the Liquidator. Nothing in this Clause shall be considered or read as compelling or requiring the Liquidator to respond to any query or to provide any clarification to the queries raised by a bidder. The Liquidator will not be held responsible for any delay in response or non-response to clarifications raised by the Bidder.

10. MODE OF SALE AND AUCTION PROCESS

- 10.1** The liquidator proposes to conduct the sale of Company on a going concern basis as contemplated under Regulation 32(e) of the Liquidation Process Regulations, 2016 through E-Auction Process Document.

The Successful Bidder shall be required to complete the sale of Company on going concern basis in accordance with the provisions of IBC and Liquidation Process Regulations, 2016. After identification of Successful Bidder, the Liquidator shall have the right to approach the Judicial Authority for obtaining suitable directions on the implementation of such sale and any such directions shall be binding on the parties to sale as per E-Auction Process Document. In case the honorable NCLT does not approve the sale of the Corporate Debtors as a going concern, the Liquidator reserves the right to appeal in the appellate court, and further in case the appellate court does not approve the Liquidator reserves the right to appeal in the Supreme Court. The timeline for payment of the balance sale consideration shall commence from the Final Approval Order, except the 1st installment which is required to be paid within 15 days of declaration as the Successful Bidder.

It is clarified that from the date of submission of the Bid, the Qualified Bidders shall not be entitled to withdraw, cancel or renegotiate the Bid under any circumstances or for any reason (including for any delay in getting the Final Approval Order) and by participating in this e-auction process, the Qualified Bidders specifically waive any such right to withdraw, cancel or renegotiate the Bid under all applicable law. In the event the Qualified Bidder makes any attempt to withdraw/cancel the Bid, renegotiate or does not complete payment of the sale consideration as per the timelines set out herein, the EMD, 1st Installment and any other amounts paid by the Bidder shall be forfeited and the Bidder shall not be entitled to a refund of the same.

10.2 Auction Process –

- (i) The Qualified Bidders will deposit earnest money to participate in the auction process.
- (ii) Thereafter, the E- Auction will take place as scheduled.
- (iii) Declaration of the Successful Bidder by the Liquidator.
- (iv) The Liquidator shall issue the LOI to the Successful Bidder which is required to be signed and accepted unconditionally by the Successful Bidder and returned to the Liquidator in 7 (seven) days duly executed, the terms of which shall be binding on the Successful Bidder.
- (v) The Successful Bidder shall be required to submit the 1st Installment of 15% of the Sale consideration amount within 15 days from issuance of the Letter of Intent by the Liquidator.
- (vi) The Liquidator will be filing an Application before the Hon'ble NCLT or other Judicial Authority for the purpose of seeking directions for implementing the sale under Liquidation of the corporate debtor as a going concern to the Successful Bidder. In case the honorable NCLT does not approve the sale of the Corporate Debtor as a going concern, the Liquidator reserves the right to appeal in the NCLAT, and further in case the NCLAT does not approve the Liquidator reserves the right to appeal in the Supreme Court. The Successful Bidder shall continue to remain liable and obligated till the Final Order is received from the Judicial Authority and thereafter the Successful Bidder's liability and obligation shall continue as per the terms of this E-Auction Process Document and/or Liquidation Process Regulations and/or LOI and/or the Final Approval Order.
- (vii) The Successful Bidder shall be required to deposit the balance sale consideration (plus applicable Taxes as determined by the Liquidator) within 30 days from the Final Approval Order of the Judicial Authority. In accordance with Paragraph 1(12) of Schedule I of the Liquidation Process Regulations, for payments made after thirty (30) days from the Final Approval Order, interest at the rate of 12% p.a. shall be payable on the balance sale consideration for the period after the said 30th day till the date of payment. Further, the LOI issued by the Liquidator shall be cancelled at the Liquidator's discretion if the payment is not received within the timelines specified in the Liquidation Process Regulations and/or this E-auction Process Document and/or the Final Approval Order and/or as directed by the Liquidator.
In case, the Judicial Authority does not approve the sale as going concern under the Final Order, the money deposited shall be returned back to the Bidder without any interest, and auction shall be conducted again or as per directions provided by Judicial Authority.
- (viii) Upon the payment of balance sale consideration, the sale of the Company on a going concern basis shall stand completed and the Liquidator shall execute a certificate of sale or sale deed to consummate the sale transaction as contemplated under this E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern) and the Liquidation Process Regulations.

10.2.2 It is clarified that any necessary approvals, consents, reliefs that may be required to be obtained by the Successful Bidder with respect to sale of the Company as a going concern as contemplated in this E-Auction Process Information Document have to be obtained by the Successful Bidder without any deviation from the time frame for payment of balance sale consideration as stipulated hereunder. The Liquidator shall not be obligated to relax any obligation of the Successful Bidder due to any failure to obtain such necessary approvals,

consents, reliefs that may be required by the Successful Bidder to consummate the transaction within the timelines set out hereunder.

- 10.3** On receipt of the entire sale consideration (plus applicable taxes and costs as determined by the Liquidator) from the Successful Bidder, the Liquidator shall execute a sale certificate in favour of the Successful Bidder for transferring the Company as a going concern to the Successful Bidder. Additionally, the Liquidator, in his discretion, shall execute a power of attorney in favour of the Successful Bidder for certain limited purposes such as authorizing the Successful Bidder to transfer the licenses and permissions, other approvals of the Company in its name, etc.
- 10.4** A Bidder can bid for sale of the Corporate Debtor as a going concern. The Qualified Bidder will have to deposit Earnest Money Deposit with respect to sale as a going concern as specified in this document, for him to participate in the bid. A Qualified Bidder intending to participate in bidding for sale as a going concern shall need to specify the same in the bid documents submitted by him to the Liquidator.
- 10.5** The Liquidator reserves the right to alter, modify, cancel or relax any of the terms and conditions mentioned in this E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern) in the interest of the liquidation process of the Company including cancellation of the E-Auction Process at any point of time. Any such alteration, modification, cancellation or relaxation of E-Auction Process shall be binding on the Bidder.
- 10.6** The Qualified Bidders, participating in the E-Auction Process, will have to Bid for an amount not less than the Reserve Price for acquiring the assets of the Company. A Qualified Bidder may improve its offer, multiple times during the E-auction process.
- 10.7** The attention of Qualified Bidders is invited to the fact that the Bidders cannot place a Bid for a value below the Reserve Price. Such Bid will stand automatically disqualified.
- 10.8** The access to the details of the assets of the Company/ Data Room will be provided only to Qualified Bidder, subject to submission of the requisite forms, documents and authorizations; Affidavit and Undertaking; executing a Confidentiality Undertaking as stated in para 6 above.
- 10.9** A Qualified Bidder, participating in the E-Auction Process, who has submitted its Bid for the Company, if declared as the Successful Bidder, shall have a right to acquire the Company through a special purpose vehicle (incorporated in India) (“SPV”). The Successful Bidder will be required to intimate the name and requisite details of the SPV (as may be required by the Liquidator), within 15 (fifteen) days from its declaration as the Successful Bidder by the Liquidator in writing. Accordingly, such acquiring SPV shall be bound by all the terms of the E- Auction Process Document (including all payment terms and the Bid Declaration Form submitted by the Qualified Bidder), as if they were the Qualified Bidder. The SPV will be required to be compliant with Section 29A of the Code and submit the “Affidavit and Undertaking” as set out in Annexure I of the E- Auction Process Document, simultaneously with the aforesaid intimation. The SPV shall also submit such necessary documents/undertakings/letters as may be required by the Liquidator within the timelines prescribed by him, at his discretion. Notwithstanding that the Successful Bidder proposes to

acquire through SPV, the Successful Bidder shall at all times continue to remain liable for carrying out its obligations (including payment obligations) as per the terms of the E- Auction Process Document.

11. EARNEST MONEY DEPOSIT

11.1 All the Bidders shall provide, prior to submission of their E- Auction, an amount of 10% of the Reserve Price of the assets of the Corporate Debtor that is to be bided for as earnest money deposit (“**EMD**”) in favour of Camson Bio Technologies Limited.

11.2 It may be noted that the Bidder may request the Liquidator to permit the Bidder to submit the EMD through its Associate or Associate Company. Such payment of the EMD by an Associate or Associate Company of the Bidder shall be accompanied by a letter in the format set out in **Format B** (Earnest Money by an Associate / Associate Company). Such an Associate or Associate Company must also be a Qualified Bidder as per the requirements specified in this E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern).

Provided that, the Liquidator reserves the right to accept such a request at its sole discretion and upon such terms and conditions as it may deem fit, including but not limited to requiring such a party to submit any authorization documents or other necessary details/documents.

11.3 In the event that the Successful Bidder is implementing the sale transaction through an SPV, the SPV will be required to submit at undertaking/declaration to the Liquidator (in a form and manner as acceptable to the Liquidator) acknowledging and confirming *inter alia* that

- (i) the Liquidator shall be entitled to deal with the EMD as per the terms of the E-Auction Process Document; and
- (ii) they are aware of the terms of the E-Auction Process Document regarding forfeiture of the EMD;
- (iii) they shall be bound by the E-Auction Process Document as though they were the Qualified Bidder.

11.4 Mode of Payment of EMD and other instructions relating to EMD

11.4.1 The EMD, which would not be bearing any interest, has to be paid by the Bidder prior to uploading the online Bid Application Form.

11.4.2 The EMD may be submitted in the form of Bank Guarantee as per the format specified hereunder or through RTGS / NEFT to the account number of the Company as provided under:

- 11.4.3 The details of any remittances in this regard shall be entered in the online form submitted by the Bidder. The entire amount shall be remitted by the Bidder(s) from one bank account only and to be owned by the Bidder. In the event the EMD is remitted by any other Person, it must be accompanied by a letter in the format set out in **Format B** (Earnest Money by an Associate / Associate Company).
- 11.4.4 Bidders shall preserve the remittance challan and shall produce the same in front of the Liquidator as and when demanded.
- 11.4.5 All the payments to be made by the Bidder under the e-auction shall be intimated to the Liquidator at camson@aaainsolvency.com with a copy to suresh.kannan@aaainsolvency.com
- 11.4.6 The EMD may be provided either:
- (i) in the form of the cash which can be deposited by the Bidder, by way of direct bank transfer to the bank account as notified by the Liquidator; and / or
 - (ii) by way of a bank guarantee issued by any leading nationalized bank or private sector bank of India in favour of the Company in **Format A**.
- 11.4.7 In the event, the EMD is submitted in the form of bank guarantee, the bank guarantee shall be renewed periodically by the Bidder till the payment of entire sale consideration and other amounts payable under this E-auction Process Document or receipt of the Final Order rejecting the sale pursuant hereto (as the case may be). Every renewal shall be done at least 30 (thirty) days prior to the expiry of the existing bank guarantee and the said renewal shall be for a minimum period of 6 (six) months. The bank guarantee shall be payable at Delhi. The bidder shall ensure that bank guarantee is stamped with adequate stamp duty as applicable in Delhi.
- 11.4.8 It should be noted that no interest will be paid to the Bidder in relation to such EMD.

11.5 Forfeiture of Earnest Money Deposit from the Bidder

 - (ii) in case Bidder is found to have made any misrepresentation or fraud; or
 - (iii) if Bidder is found to be ineligible to submit the Bid as per the conditions set out in Section 29A of the IBC (as amended from time to time) or is found to have made a false or misleading declaration of eligibility as per the conditions set out in Section 29A of the IBC (as amended from time to time); or
 - (iv) if the Successful Bidder attempts to reduce/renege the Bid amount under any

circumstances;

- (v) if the Bidder withdraws/cancels or make any attempt to withdraw or cancel its Bid at any time; or
- (vi) if the Successful Bidder fails to renew the bank guarantee provided for the EMD till the Final Order and keep the same valid for a period of 6 months thereafter; or
- (vii) if the Successful Bidder fails to make the payment of the 1st Installment Payment within 15 days from the declaration as Successful Bidder in accordance with the terms of the E-Auction Process Document; or
- (viii) If the Bidder is identified as the Successful bidder and it fails to extend the validity of the EMD through the bank guarantee or does not accept the Letter of Intent issued by the Liquidator; or
- (ix) if the Successful Bidder, fails to make the complete payment within the time stipulated in the Liquidation Process Regulations as per the terms of letter of intent issued by the Liquidator and/or the Final Approval Order.

11.5.2 In case of occurrence of any of the above events:

- (i) all the amounts deposited by the Bidder or any other Person on its behalf till that date shall be forfeited and the Bidder or any other Person shall not be entitled to refund of the same;
- (ii) the option to acquire the assets of the Company / Company will be offered to the next highest Bidder.

11.6 Other terms

11.6.1 In case at the end of the auction, a successful bid is received for sale of the Corporate Debtor as a going concern which is higher than the Reserve Price and to the satisfaction of the Liquidator, then the Liquidator shall return the EMD to the unsuccessful bidders who have bid under this E-Auction Process Document within 15 days of the closure of the E-Auction process. Further, the Liquidator reserves the right to process under Liquidation Regulation 32A (4) which says that “If the liquidator is unable to sell the corporate debtor or its business under clause (e) or (f) of regulation 32 within ninety days from the liquidation commencement date, he shall proceed to sell the assets of the corporate debtor under clauses (a) to (d) of regulation 32.”

11.6.2 In case the E-Auction fails, then the EMD paid by the Bidder shall be returned (without interest) to such applicant within 15 (fifteen) days of the date of closure of E-Auction Process.

11.6.3 For Successful Bidders, an email confirmation will be given for being Successful Bidder on the next day of the E-Auction.

12. LETTER OF INTENT

12.1 The Successful Bidder shall be required to execute a LOI provided by the Liquidator within a period of 7 (seven) days from the E-Auction date, and record unconditional acceptance of the LOI by providing the Liquidator with one copy of LOI with an endorsement stating that LOI is accepted unconditionally under the signature of the representative of the Successful Bidder, which shall be binding on the Successful Bidder. The LOI may be cancelled only by the Liquidator in his discretion as per the terms of this E-Auction Process Document.

13. PAYMENT OF 1ST INSTALLMENT

13.1 The successful bidder shall be required to submit 15% of the sale consideration amount to the Liquidator within 15 days of the issuance of the letter of intent with respect to sale as a going concern, as “1st Installment” of Payment.

13.2 Mode of Payment of 1st Installment

13.2.1 The 1st Installment, which would not be bearing any interest, has to be paid by the Bidder within 15 days of the issuance of the Letter of Intent by the Liquidator.

13.2.3 Bidders shall preserve the remittance challan and shall produce the same in front of the Liquidator as and when demanded.

13.3 Forfeiture of 1ST Installment of Payment from the Bidder

It is to be noted that the 1st Installment of Payment furnished can be forfeited at any time, upon the occurrence of any of the following events:

- (i) if there is a breach of any of the conditions under this E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern) by the Successful Bidder or in case Successful Bidder is found to have made any misrepresentation or fraud; or
- (ii) if Successful Bidder is found to be ineligible to submit the Bid as per the conditions set out in Section 29A of the IBC (as amended from time to time) or is found to have made a false or misleading declaration of eligibility as per the conditions set out in Section 29A of the IBC (as amended from time to time); or

- (iii) if the Successful Bidder withdraws/cancels or make any attempt to withdraw or cancel its Bid at any time; or
- (iv) if the Successful Bidder attempts to reduce/renegotiate the Bid amount under any circumstances;
- (v) if the Successful Bidder fails to renew the bank guarantee provided for the EMD till the Final Order and keep the same valid for a period of 6 months thereafter; or
- (vi) if the Successful Bidder fails to make the payment of the balance sale consideration within the timelines specified under the Liquidation Process Regulations and as per the terms of the E-Auction Process Document and/or the Final Approval Order.

In case of occurrence of any of the above events, all the amounts deposited till that date shall be forfeited and the option to acquire the assets of the Company / Company will be offered to the next highest Bidder. It is clarified that the Liquidator shall in his discretion have the right to offer the option to acquire the assets of the Company, both to the next highest bidder under sale of the Corporate Debtor as a going concern or to determine the successful bidders under other options as provided under Regulation 32 (a) to (d) and offer the option to acquire the assets of the Company to them.

14. SET-OFF OF EMD AND BALANCE PAYMENT

- 14.1** Upon receipt of the signed Letter of Intent and the 1st Installment of Payment from the Successful Bidder, the Liquidator shall file an application before the Hon'ble NCLT for the purpose of seeking directions for implementing the sale under Liquidation of the corporate debtor as a going concern to the Successful Bidder. In case the Hon'ble NCLT does not approve the sale of the Corporate Debtor as a going concern, the Liquidator reserves the right to appeal in the NCLAT, and further in case the NCLAT does not approve the Liquidator reserves the right to appeal in the Supreme Court till the Final Order comes.
- 14.2** The sale contemplated under this E-Auction Process document shall be consummated on receipt of the Final Approval Order from any of the Judicial Authority.
- 14.3** The Successful Bidder shall pay the entire balance sale consideration i.e. 75% of the sale consideration (plus applicable Taxes as determined by the Liquidator) within 30 days from the date of the Final Approval Order. In accordance with Paragraph 1(12) of Schedule I of the Liquidation Process Regulations, for payments made after thirty (30) days from the Final Approval Order, interest at the rate of 12% p.a. shall be payable on the balance sale consideration for the period after the said 30th day till the date of payment.
- 14.4** Unless expressly indicated by the Liquidator, the EMD (if provided by way of cash transfer) and 1st Installment shall be set-off against or used as part of the consideration that the Successful Bidder proposes to offer as a sale consideration for the Company. In the event that the Successful Bidder/any entity on behalf of the successful Bidder has provided Earnest Money by way of Bank Guarantee (as per format provided herein), the EMD shall be

released only and when the full payment of the entire sale consideration (plus applicable taxes as determined by the Liquidator) is made by the Successful Bidder to the Liquidator.

14.5 Upon receipt of the balance sale consideration (plus applicable taxes as determined by the Liquidator) and other costs as determined by the Liquidator from the Successful Bidder within 30 days of the Final Approval Order from the Judicial Authority, the sale of the Company on a going concern basis shall stand completed and the Liquidator shall execute a certificate of sale or sale deed to consummate the sale transaction as contemplated under this E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern) and the Liquidation Process Regulations.

15. NON-RECEIPT OF APPROVAL FROM THE JUDICIAL AUTHORITY

15.1 On receipt of the 1st Installment, the Liquidator shall have the right to file an application before the Hon'ble NCLT for approval of the sale of the Company as a going concern to the Successful Bidder pursuant to the terms of this E-Auction Process. In the event that the Hon'ble NCLT approves the said transaction, the same shall be construed as the Final Approval Order and the timelines for payment and other obligations of the Successful Bidder shall commence from the date of the receipt of the Final Approval Order from the NCLT.

15.2 In the event the NCLT does not approve the sale of the Company as a going concern to the Successful Bidder, the Liquidator shall have a right (but not an obligation) to file an appeal with NCLAT. In the event that the Hon'ble NCLAT approves the said transaction, the same shall be construed as the Final Approval Order and the timelines for payment and other obligations of the Successful Bidder shall commence from the date of the receipt of the Final Approval Order from the NCLAT.

15.3 In the event the NCLAT does not approve the sale of the Company as a going concern to the Successful Bidder, the Liquidator shall have a right (but not an obligation) to file an appeal with the Supreme Court. In the event that the Supreme Court approves the said transaction, the same shall be construed as the Final Approval Order and the timelines for payment and other obligations of the Successful Bidder shall commence from the date of the receipt of the Final Approval Order from the Supreme Court.

15.4 In the event, the Final Order is passed by the Judicial Authority rejecting the sale on going concern basis pursuant to this E-Auction Process Document and the same is not appealed by the Liquidator in the NCLAT or the Supreme Court (as the case may be), the Liquidator shall return/refund the EMD and 1st Installment payment made by the Successful Bidder within 60 days from the receipt of the Final Order. No interest shall be payable by the Liquidator on the said amounts to be refunded to the Successful Bidder.

15.5 In case the leasehold/licensed rights with respect to the land & building of the Corporate Debtor is not transferred to the Successful Bidder for any reason whatsoever within a period of two years from the date of issuance of the Letter of Intent/Award by the Liquidator to the Successful Bidder, the entire amount given by way of bank guarantee as a part of the balance sale consideration amount shall be forthwith returned to the Successful Bidder.

16. DECLARATION OF SUCCESSFUL BIDDER

The Liquidator at the end of the E-Auction Process upon examination of the bids received under sale of the Corporate Debtor as a going concern, shall declare the Successful Bidder(s) as per the Clause 11.6.3 above. The Successful Bidder(s) shall be determined on the basis of highest Bid received in respect of sale of Company on going concern basis in accordance with the provisions of IBC and Liquidation Process Regulations read with Terms & Conditions as specified in the E-auction portal. In case of any dispute / discrepancy, the Liquidator shall assess the E-Auction applications and declare the Successful Bidder(s) offering maximum value for the auction of the Company. This right of selecting and declaring the Successful Bidder(s) shall always solely rest with the Liquidator.

17. FRAUDULENT AND CORRUPT PRACTICES

The Bidder shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the E-Auction Process and subsequently during the closure of the E-Auction Process and during the declaration of the Successful Bidder. - ii. engaging in any manner whatsoever, during the E- Auction Process or thereafter, any person in respect of any matter relating to the Company, who at any time has been or is a legal, financial or technical adviser of the Liquidator or the Company, in relation to any matter concerning the E-Auction Process;

“fraudulent practice” shall mean a misrepresentation or omission of facts or suppression of facts or disclosure of incomplete facts, in order to influence the E-Auction Process;

“restrictive practice” shall mean forming a cartel or arriving at any understanding or arrangement among the Bidders with the objective of restricting or manipulating a full and fair competition in the E-Auction Process; and

“undesirable practice” shall mean (i) establishing contact with any person connected with or employed or engaged by the liquidator with the objective of canvassing, lobbying or in any manner influencing or attempting to influence the E-Auction Process; or (ii) having a conflict of interest.

The Bidder shall not involve himself or for any of his Representatives in price manipulation of any kind directly or indirectly under the Applicable Law(s) by communicating with other Bidders.

The Bidder shall not divulge either his Bid or any other details provided to him by the Liquidator or during the due diligence process in respect of the Company to any other party. 18. COSTS, EXPENSES AND TAX IMPLICATIONS

18.1 The Bidder shall be responsible for all the costs incurred by it on account of its participation in the E-Auction Process, including any costs associated with participation in the discussion meeting (if any), Site Visit, etc. The Liquidator shall not be responsible in any way for such costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the E-Auction Process.

19. GOVERNING LAW AND JURISDICTION

This E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern), the E-Auction Process and the other documents pursuant to the E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern) shall be governed by the laws of India and any dispute arising out of or in relation to the E-Auction Process Information Document (Sale of Corporate Debtor as a Going Concern) or the E-Auction Process shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the NCLT, courts and tribunals at **Bangalore**, India. In addition, the bank guarantee provided by the Bidder in relation to the

EMD as per Format A of this document shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts and tribunals at Delhi.

As per recent SEBI Board Meeting PR No.61/2020 dated 16.12.2020, amendments have been carried out for minimum public holding for listed companies undergoing CIRP.

“Recalibration of Minimum Public Shareholding norms for listed companies going through Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process (CIRP)

Presently, during Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process (CIRP) where the public shareholding falls below 10%, such listed companies are required to bring the public shareholding to at least 10% within a period of 18 months and to 25% within 36 months.

In this context, the Board has decided the following in respect of companies which continue to remain listed as a result of implementation of the resolution plan under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code:

i. Such companies will be mandated to have at least 5% public shareholding at the time of their admission to dealing on stock exchange, as against no minimum requirement at present.

ii. Further, such companies will be provided 12 months to achieve public shareholding of 10% from the date such shares of the company are admitted to dealings on stock exchange and 36 months to achieve public shareholding of 25% from the said date.

iii. The lock-in on equity shares allotted to the resolution applicant under the resolution plan shall not be applicable to the extent to achieve 10% public shareholding within 12 months.

iv. Such companies shall be required to make additional disclosures, such as, specific details of resolution plan including details of assets post-CIRP, details of securities continuing to be imposed on the companies ‘assets and other material liabilities imposed on the company, proposed steps to be taken by the incoming investor/acquirer for achieving the minimum public shareholding (MPS) and quarterly disclosure of the status of achieving the MPS.¶

20. TIMETABLE
